However, in that employment, Respondent shall not make any home visits. February 2, 2010

Respondent failed to comply with terms and conditions of a July 2007 diversion agreement.

Respondent's July 2007 diversion agreement was terminated and her license to practice as a registered nurse was suspended with a stay of enforcement on the suspension. Said license was placed on probation for five years subject to the terms and conditions in the July 2007 diversion agreement. However, it should be noted that Respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse expired on January 31, 2009.

The probationary condition requiring Respondent to participate in a professional support group (PIR) is amended to allow Respondent to attend either a professional support group (PIR) or a 12-Step program, such as AA/NA, provided she attend at least one support group meeting per week. February 8, 2010

Between May 2004 and August 2009 Respondent issued controlled substance prescriptions and legend drug prescriptions to patients in Utah when she was not properly licensed to do so because she was only authorized to administer controlled substances and not prescribe. Respondent also failed to keep accurate records of controlled substances for which she had accountability.

Respondent voluntarily surrendered her license to practice as an APRN/CRNA w/out prescriptive privileges and her license to administer controlled substances. Respondent may not reapply for a nursing type license for a period of five years. February 18, 2010
