If and when Respondent is issued a license to administer/prescribe controlled substances, said license will be revoked with a stay of enforcement on the revocation and said license will be placed on probation for three years. Respondent's license to practice as a dentist was revoked with a stay of enforcement on the revocation. Said dentist license is placed on probation for three years with conditions and restrictions. August 3, 2010

Respondent's license to practice as a dentist in Colorado was disciplined in March 2010.

Respondent's licenses to practice as a dentist and to administer and prescribe controlled substances were renewed. Both licenses were revoked with a stay of enforcement on the revocation. Both licenses are suspended until the State of Colorado lifts the suspension on his license to practice in that state.
