Those prescription medications were at times received by Respondent from the licensed Utah pharmacy, held by Respondent and subsequently dispensed by Respondent directly to Respondent's customers or at time given to the customer's authorized representatives who then delivered the medications to the customers. The Utah licensed pharmacy would then submit the insurance claims to the insurance company. Respondent, while neither admitting nor denying the Division's findings of fact, agreed to the following: Respondent was ordered to cease and desist from the following: (1) engaging in the conduct described in this Stipulation and Order to the extent prohibited by Subsections 58-1-501(2)(a) and 58-17b-502(2); (2) allowing excess supplies of prescription drugs to be ordered by customers; (3) providing compensation in any form to customers for claims submitted on the customers insurance, although this provision shall not limit payments to owners of Respondent who may also be patients, so long as such payments are based upon the ownership in Respondent company, as recorded with the Division, and not for claims submitted; and (4) allowing prescription medication to be held outside his pharmacy or at a third party location for subsequent dispensing to the customer. The delivery of prescription medication by a representative of Respondent is permissible. September 27, 2011

Respondent engaged in unprofessional and unlawful conduct when she filled prescriptions for her own use that provided for refills of the prescriptions, when in fact the prescribing practitioner had not authorized refills of the prescriptions. **Respondent, without admitting or denying the Division's findings of fact, agreed to the following:**
