As a part of the cease and desist order entered, Respondent agreed to specifically cease and desist from the following conduct at any and all locations associated with Respondent or any affiliate entities for which Respondent has an interest in: (1) Respondent shall only store and administer patient specific medications obtained lawfully from a Utah licensed pharmacy; (2) Respondent shall not store, house, administer, dispense or distribute prescription medications or controlled substances that Respondent obtained from former patients; (3) Respondent shall not utilize the identity or license of prescribing practitioners who are employees or who are otherwise associated with Respondent in any way, in order to obtain prescription medication or controlled substances to stockpile for later use; (4) Respondent shall only administer medication to patients based upon a lawful, valid prescription issued by a prescribing practitioner acting lawfully within the scope of their licensure; and (5) Respondent shall not allow unlicensed individuals to administer or dispense prescription medication or controlled substances to Respondent's patients and clients.
