

Utah Multistate License

Registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) who live in Utah and meet the [uniform licensure requirements](#) may be eligible for a multistate license (Compact license).

The Utah Board of Nursing will issue a multistate license if the applicant is either:

- Living in Utah (Utah must be the applicant's Primary State of Residence)
- Licensed by Exam (new graduates seeking to take the NCLEX through Utah)
- Licensed by Endorsement (transferring a license into Utah as a new Utah resident)
- Upgrading/converting a single state license into a multistate/compact license. The applicant will be required to provide and email a current Utah driver's license to b7@utah.gov.

Note: An LPN licensed through education equivalency is not eligible for a multistate license.
